APPLICATION PROCESS SUMMARY

NIDA encourages applications from people from diverse backgrounds, with different levels of experience in their chosen area of interest.

The application process for the CUA501020 Diploma of Screen and Media (Specialist Make-up Services) consists of two rounds:

Round One - Online Application and Portfolio (due Monday 10th November 2025, 5:00pm AEST)

Round Two - Online Written Response and Interview

Only applicants who are successful in Round One will be invited to attend a Round Two interview or callback audition.

BEFORE APPLYING

Before completing your application, please read the following information:

- Applicants for NIDA's Diploma Courses MUST be an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen, or Australian permanent resident. This course does not accept international students.
- Course information, dates, fees and frequently asked questions available on the website.

CONDITIONS OF APPLYING

- There are no application fees for 2026 applicants.
- Applications for the 2026 intake of CUA51020 Diploma of Screen and Media (Specialist Makeup Services) close on Monday 10th November 2025. NIDA may not be able to accept applications after this date.
- There are a limited number of places available in each of our diploma courses.
 Selection is based on merit; not all applicants who meet the published entry requirements will receive a study offer.
- All applicants are required to review the course information, including the schedule of tuition fees, published on the course page.
- It is not possible to provide applicants with individual written or oral feedback on their audition.
- Applicants who receive a study offer for 2026 must accept the offer within the time frame indicated.

ROUND ONE

Online Application and Audition

STEP 1

Creating your account

- Create your application account in the Application Portal: apply.nida.edu.au.
- You will receive an email with your login details.



STEP 2

Logging into your account

Log in to the Application Portal and click the 'Applicant Login' button.




Start a new application

- Select the green 'New Application' button and complete the online form.
- You will be asked to submit your personal details, examples of previous experience and reasons for interest in this course.

Important Note...

- You are able to save your application and return to it at any point before the closing date.
- To do so, click the pencil icon to the right of the course you wish to continue applying for (refer to the image below).
- You can only edit if the 'Application Status' is set to 'In Process'. Once you submit your application, this option will not be available.

STEP 3

Upload your documents

All Round One applicants must upload the following documents:

- Evidence of your most recent qualification if you have one (e.g. a school report, Higher School Certificate, university transcript, statement of attainment).
- Proof of identification and citizenship (e.g. Australian passport, Australian driver's licence, birth certificate. The scanned document needs to show your date of birth).
- A recent photograph (head and shoulders, in colour, well lit, plain background).
- One introduction/audition video as a link to an unlisted YouTube video.

Please ensure all documents are either PDF, PNG or JPEG file types. The max file upload size is 80Mb

Agreeing to the terms and conditions

You will be prompted to agree to the terms and conditions of application and click submit.

Put a portfolio together and upload it

We want to see your style and experience to give us an idea of you as a creative. So, you'll need to put together a portfolio. Your portfolio may include:

- Photos or draft examples of your makeup looks, art, designs, concepts, ideas, anything that showcases your creative work.
- If you have any records of makeup/creative work you've done at home, independently, at school, or in the industry, please include this too.

Helpful Tips...

- o Once you have these, put them together in 1 document.
- Name your portfolio: fullname_portfolio_DSMS26
- Upload your Portfolio in the 'Course Specific Application Requirements' attachment section of your online application.

Record your introduction video

As part of your application, you are required to provide a link to a pre-recorded video introduction.

The following information should act as a guide for how set up and film your introduction.

- Introduce yourself! Tell us your name and application number.
- Tell us about your experience with technical production.
- Tell us about why you're interested in the course

Most importantly, relax and just be yourself!

Helpful Tips...

- Your introduction should be around 1 minute in length.
- The space you record in should be well lit and not too cramped. (You should have enough space to move around freely.)
- Make sure your recording devices (phone/microphone/camera) are of a decent quality, so we can hear and see you properly.

If using your mobile phone, shoot in landscape, NOT portrait.

STEP 4

Edit and upload your introduction

All Round One introductions are to be submitted as video links in the appropriate field of the online application.

- Review your recordings and pick out which one you want to submit.
- When you are happy, upload your video to YouTube.
 Make sure it is 'Unlisted'. This means only people with the link can view your audition.
 You are responsible for ensuring that your video link works before submitting your application.
- Your video description should include your name and NIDA Applicant number (e.g., A12345). Eg: fullnameandapplicantnumber_introduction_DSMS26

Because you are submitting your introduction WITH your online application, your video must be completed and submitted BEFORE the deadline: 5:00pm, Monday 10th November 2025.

You will receive a confirmation email when your application has been successfully submitted.


APPLICATION CONFIRMATION AND OUTCOME

You will be informed via email of your outcome in Round One.

If we have invited you to a attend a callback interview for Round Two, we encourage you to attend in person. It is important to remember, not everyone who submits a video will be invited to a callback in Round Two.

Applicants who are invited to the Round Two callback interviews, will receive an email with details and instructions on how to accept your invite, and how to select your recall interview date and location.

ROUND TWO

Callback Interview

STEP 1

Outcome email

All applicants will be notified regarding the outcome of their application status.

If you are successful in the first round, you will receive an email inviting you to attend the second round for a callback interview. Callback interviews take place in person and online, during November 2025.

Select your recall date and location

Callback interviews occur in Sydney.

Online callback interviews are available for those who are unable to attend in person.

To book your recall location and time, click the link in your callback invite, or log into the application portal using your login credentials.

You can then select the city and date from the lists of available callback sessions.

STEP 2

Prepare for your callback interview

Before the day of your callback, make sure you have prepared and completed the following:

- Complete a questionnaire provided to you in your callback invitation.
- Have your portfolio prepared and ready to bring with you. Your portfolio should showcase your work as a make-up artist (this can be digital or physical), it can also showcase drawings and paintings.

• Submission of at least 1 minimum professional reference, if you have not worked professionally, you may provide a personal reference.

Double check the location, date, and time of your callback. This ensures you arrive
in the right place, at the right time for your callback.

Day of your callback

Wear comfortable clothing that you can easily move around in, and make sure to bring your water bottle.

Make sure you arrive relaxed and ready to start your callback. It is recommended that you aim to be 10 to 15 minutes early for your callback. This ensures the callback session starts on time

During your callback, you will be asked:

To complete a face chart based on a creative design provided on the day.

Discuss your previous training and performance experience.

Your session will involve others who are interviewing for the course, and staff members from the course. It is an opportunity for us to meet you, and for you to meet us.

CALLBACK OUTCOME

If we can offer you a place on the course, we will contact you in November-December 2025 via phone and sent an email to advise you of your course offer.

You will be given a period in which to consider accepting or rejecting your course offer for the 2026 intake.

If you are selected to be shortlisted, you will be contacted in November-December 2025. We will inform shortlisted applicants if we are able to offer you a place on the course via phone or email.

FAQs

Are there requirements needed to apply for this course?

- Yes, Applicants seeking admission must: be an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen, or Australian permanent resident. This course does not accept international students.
- You must have reached the age of 18 before the commencement of the course (in some circumstances NIDA may select candidates who turn 18 during their course).
- You have completed your Higher School Certificate (HSC) or equivalent; ATAR is not required.
- Demonstrate a high level of practical ability, potential and motivation at the interview or audition.
- Complete the interview/audition requirements for the course.

Can I apply for more than one course?

Yes, however a separate online application form is required for each course you would like to apply for.

What ATAR do I need to get into NIDA?

Entry into NIDA is by audition or interview only. We do not ask for exam scores or ATARs.

What do I do if I haven't received my login details for my application account?

If you do not receive any automated emails from NIDA regarding your application account, please check your junk/spam/promotions filter. If you are still experiencing difficulties, please contact us at applications@nida.edu.au.

Where will my callback take place?

CUA51020 Diploma of Screen and Media (Specialist Make-up Services) Round One auditions will take place via pre-recorded video submission. Round Two callback auditions will take place in-person or online (dates, times, and locations TBC).

Does NIDA give audition/interview feedback?

Due to the large number of people being interviewed, it is not possible for NIDA to provide individual feedback.

What happens after my audition/interview?

Final selections are made for each course in December, and study offers will be distributed to successful applicants via email.

When can I apply for scholarships for NIDA?

As part of the application process, once applicants have submitted a course application, they can then submit a scholarship application. See <u>NIDA Scholarships</u>.

You can apply for a scholarship once you have submitted your course application form. If you are shortlisted and offered a place at NIDA, we will then schedule an interview to review your scholarship application.
