

APPLICATION PERIOD

Open Monday 10th June 2025 - Close Monday 29th September 2025, 11:59pm (AEST) Late applications may be considered depending on interview schedule availability.

APPLICATION PROCESS SUMMARY

The application process for the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Technical Theatre and Stage Management) consists of two rounds:

Round One - Online Application and Technical Theatre and Stage Management Project Part A (due Monday 29th September 2025, 11:59pm AEST)

Round Two - Technical Theatre and Stage Management Project Part B and Interview

All applicants who submit the required elements for Round One will be invited to Round Two and will need to complete the Technical Theatre and Stage Management Project and attend an interview.

ONLINE APPLICATION

STEP 1 - Application Portal



Log in to the Application Portal and click the 'Applicant Login' button.




IMPORTANT NOTE:

STEP 2 - Collect the following documents for your application

- Copy of your most recent qualification (e.g. school report, Higher School Certificate, diploma, university transcript or testamur)
- Proof of identification showing your date of birth (e.g. passport, driver's licence, birth certificate)

International applicants (and non-Australian citizens with permanent visas) must <u>also</u> submit

- A copy of your passport (must be valid for at least the first 12 months of your course)
- Proof of 7.0 Academic IELTS or equivalent for BFA (Technical Theatre and Stage Management)
- If you have a Permanent Visa (e.g. Permanent Resident, Partner visa Subclass 801), we require a copy of your visa.

Please ensure all documents are either PDF, PNG or JPEG file types. The max file upload size is 80Mb

TECHNICAL THEATRE AND STAGE MANAGEMENT PROJECT PART A

STEP 3 – Submit Project Part A

Select one script from the list below. They should be available from your local library, bookstore, or online. Should you have any difficulty obtaining any of these texts, please contact NIDA.

- Rhinoceros by Eugène Ionesco (play)
- Blood Wedding by Federico García Lorca (play)
- The Drover's Wife by Leah Purcell (play)
- The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui by Bertolt Brecht (play)
- Bran Nue Dae by Jimmy Chi (musical)

You must read the script and prepare a one-page word document that outlines your ideas for staging this production. You should consider one or more of the following production elements — lighting, sound, video and staging. It may be staged in a venue/location of your choice, or you may use the provided theatre plans (see the Appendix).

Please title your Project Part A with your name as follows:

You must upload your Project Part A in the 'Course Specific Application Requirements' attachment section.

STEP 4 — Complete and submit your application

To complete your application, agree on the Terms and Conditions by ticking the boxes, then enter your name and date of application.

Only applicants who are successful in Round One will be invited for interview.

You will be advised by email if you are successful in Round One.

If you are successful in Round One, you will receive an email confirmation and you will need to log into the Application Portal to select an interview time within a week from date of notification. Interviews may be in-person or over Microsoft Teams, in which case a Teams link will be provided to you prior to your interview.

All efforts will be made to give successful Round One applicants their preferred interview date, but NIDA cannot guarantee the date and time – it is subject to staff availability. If your selected time cannot be accommodated, NIDA will send you an email advising you of the new interview time.

Your Technical Theatre and Stage Management Project Part B must be ready to present at your interview. Please read through the instructions before submitting your application.

TECHNICAL THEATRE AND STAGE MANAGEMENT PROJECT PART B

STEP 5 – **Prepare and submit Project Part B**

Present your ideas for the staging the script you chose for Project Part A to the panel. You may present in any format you choose (e.g images, sketches, slides). You should consider one or more of the following production elements — lighting, sound, video and staging. It may be staged in a venue/location of your choice, or you may use the provided theatre plans (see Appendix)

Any digital files for your project should be submitted EITHER as a single PDF, with all elements; OR as a compressed zip folder containing all the required elements. You will send these documents via email. This email will be provided on completion of Round One.

Your Technical Theatre and Stage Management Project Part B must be ready to present at your interview.

Please title your Project Part B with your name as follows:

STEP 6 - Attend your Interview

We know that interviews can be stressful, but we will do our best to make your experience as relaxing and enjoyable as possible.

The interview process is friendly, informal, and open, and is designed to give you the best opportunity to show us your potential and readiness to study at NIDA. The first half of the interview we will discuss your project, and in the second half of your interview we will give you the opportunity to tell us about yourself.

Remember, the more time and effort you put into your application and project, the better prepared you will be, and the more you will enjoy the interview.

You will be advised by email of the outcome of your interview.

CONDITIONS OF APPLYING

- Selection is based on merit; not all applicants who meet the published minimum entry requirements will receive a study offer.
- All applicants are responsible for reviewing the course requirements and tuition fees as stated on the NIDA website.
- It is not possible to provide applicants with individual written or oral feedback on their audition/interview.
- Applicants who receive a study offer for 2026 must accept the offer within the time frame indicated.
- It is not possible to defer a study offer at NIDA.

FAQs:

CAN I APPLY FOR MORE THAN ONE COURSE?

Yes, however a separate online application form is required for each course you would like to apply for.

WHAT ATAR DO I NEED TO GET INTO NIDA?

Entry into NIDA is by audition or interview only. We do not ask for exam scores or ATARs. However, all applicants applying for any higher education course at NIDA must have completed their Higher School Certificate or equivalent.

WHAT DO I DO IF I HAVEN'T RECEIVED LOGIN DETAILS OF MY APPLICATION ACCOUNT?

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER MY AUDITION/INTERVIEW?


Final selections are made for each course in December, and study offers will be distributed to successful applicants via email.
